MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF TARRANT COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE HELD IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE IN FORT WORTH, TEXAS, ON THE 8TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1953, AT 2:00 P.N.

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The call of the roll disclosed the presence or absence of Directors, as follows:

#### PRESENT

### ABSENT

Joe B. Hogsett Houston Hill Dan H. Priest W. L. Pier A. T. Seymour, Jr.

Also present were Sidney L. Samuels, General Counsel and C. L. McNair, General Manager of the District.

Director Hogsett acted in his capacity as President, and Director Priest acted in his capacity as Secretary, whereupon proceedings were had and done, as follows:

### 1.

The Directors had previously received copies of the minutes of a meeting held on December 19, 1952, at 10:30 A.M. Having found no objections thereto, it was ordered that they be approved, signed and placed on record.

2.

Attached to these minutes as Exhibit "A" is a statement of the financial condition of this District to which reference is made. Exhibit "A" shows that proposed voucher-checks #3358 to #3464, inclusive, had been issued for the total sum \$53,593.17. There was full consideration of the proposed voucher-checks and the data to support same, whereupon Director Pier moved, seconded by Director Priest, that the issued voucher-checks above listed be confirmed,

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and that the accounts payable be approved as covered by the proposed voucher-checks and that such checks be issued and delivered to the respective persons entitled to receive them. It was so ordered, subject to the usual audit.

3.

The monthly report dated January 2, 1953, of C. L. McNair, General Manager, for the months of November and December, 1952, wax received, presented and ordered filed as Exhibit "B" to these minutes.

4.

Director Priest was instrumental in calling to the attention of the Board what appeared to be a conflict between the recitations in paragraph No. 2 of the minutes of March 8, 1951, and those of November 14, 1951, concerning the authority to purchase lands and easements for floodway purposes. However, upon investigation of the subject, it was found that both sets of minutes provided that the ultimate approval of lands so acquired rested in the Board of Directors and that, in substance, the minutes of both such meetings (March 8, 1951 and November 15, 1951) contained no element of inconsistency. In each instance the Board of Directors was declared to be the ultimate authority on such matters.

In the minutes of March 8, 1951, on motion of Director Priest, seconded by Director Hill, it was resolved that, in the acquisition and purchase of easements or fee title to lands essential to the Floodway Project, Mr. Hickey, the Land Agent of the District, and Mr. C. L. McNair, the General Manager of the District, should confer together upon such matters and agree thereon, and that having

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agreed, in order to facilitate and hasten the purchase of such properties for the Floodway Project the conclusions of Mr. Hickey and Mr. McNair be further submitted to Mr. Hogsett as President of the Board, or Mr. Houston Hill, as Vice President, for ultimate approval, and that later when such approval was so obtained, such purchases be ratified by the Board of Directors at a meeting general or special.

In the minutes of November 14, 1951, the subject matter of this particular phase was introduced through a report of Mr. Hickey to the effect that there were no other or further funds available to the District in the Tax Remission Fund that had been placed in the hands of the Commissioners Court by the State Legislature, which could be utilized for the purchase of lands, easements, rights-of-way or other purposes in aid of the Flood Control Project. In the discussion that followed the introductory remarks of Mr. Hickey, it was resolved on motion of Director Stone, seconded by Director Priest, that thereafter, in the purchase of such properties for the Flood Control Program, funds for the acquisition of such properties should be derived from the District's "Construction Fund" growing out of the issuance of bonds for the District in the election held in October, 1950.

It was further agreed that in all instances where such purchases were contemplated the forms of same and the amount to be paid for them should be submitted to the Board, and no action taken thereon until or unless the Board ordered such to be taken or to be made.

This course had been followed theretofore, save and except, that in the preliminary stage of negotiations for the purchase of

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such properties it was agreed, in order to facilitate the matters, because of the difficulties that stood in the way of agreement with the owners of such properties, that Director Hogsett and Director Hill be consulted, but it was also stipulated that the action became final when the matter of such purchase had been sumitted to the Board for official action thereon.

There was no essential difference between the two sets of minutes except that the monies for the purchase of such easements and rights-of-way are now derived from the "Construction Fund" and not from the Tax Remission Fund, because the latter fund had been exhausted.

Following this explanation, on motion of Director Priest, seconded by Director Pier, the action heretofore taken in the matter of such purchases wherein Director Hogsett and Director Hill, or either one of them had been consulted, be once again approved and ratified in all things; further, that pursuant to the language of both sets of minutes hereinbefore mentioned, before the conclusion of any such purchase for the Floodway Program and before the terms thereon be finally agreed upon that same be submitted to the Board of Directors for authority and approval. The motion was unanimously carried in all respects, all the Directors present Voting "aye" thereon.

5.

There being no further business before the Board, the meeting thereupon adjourned.

NOTE: The Maintenance Fund owns \$350,000.00 par value United States Government Securities, and \$45,000.00 par value this District's Bonds, which are in the Safekeeping Department of the Fort Worth National Bank of Fort Worth, Texas.

The Construction Fund owns \$6,500,000.00 par value United States Government Securities, which are in the Safekeeping Department of the Fort Worth National Bank, Fort Worth, Texas.

The Interest and Sinking Fund owns \$800,000.00 United States Securities which are in the Safekeeping Department of the Fort Worth National Bank, Fort Worth, Texas. In addition to the \$800,000.00 U. S. Securities mentioned, the Interest and Sinking Fund also owns Fourteen (14) Vendor's Lien promissory notes of J.D. Craft, bearing date of July 1, 1952, aggregating the sum \$70,000.00, each of said notes being in the principal sum of \$5,000.00, with interest thereon at 4% per annum, payable annually at the office of the District in Fort Worth, Texas, said Fourteen notes maturing on or before seven, eight, nine, ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen, sixteen, seventeen, eighteen, nineteen and twenty years.

On August 18, 1952, Mr. Craft paid the first two (2) notes with interest thereon. On Oct. 20, 1952, Mr. Craft paid the Third and fourth notes with interest thereon. On the 28th of October, 1952, Mr. Craft paid the fifth note with interest thereon. On December 22, 1952, Mr. Craft paid the sixth note with interest thereon. The fourteen notes of J. D. Craft are in the District's office.

### Gentlemen: REPORT FOR NOVEMBER and DECEMBER, 1952.

The diminishing supply of stored water in 1952, which, in some areas, has been critically low, has become a major problem for many cities of Texas.

The capacities of the District's Lakes have been estimated from capacity curves developed in 1928.

The Directors, after a thorough discussion of the District's water supply, on October 20, 1952, authorized a survey to be made in order to determine as accurately as possible the present quantity of water stored in Eagle Mountain and Bridgeport Lakes. The City of Fort Worth also authorized a survey for Lake Worth.

A written report of the survey was submitted December 8, 1952, by Freese and Nichols, Consulting Engineers.

### CONDITION OF LAKES

The following quantity of stored water is based on the capacity curves determined from the recent survey.
