











expected to fall during a specified time period in the future. Because precipitation can vary significantly over short distances. QPFs are reported as the expected "areal average"

on a 20-kilometer (12.4 mile) grid. Several factors contribute

to QPF estimates, including the current state of the atmosphere, modeled pressure systems, satellite trends, and




Mountain
